CLAY OVEN

At the end of August, thanks to Forestry Commission 'Community Seedcorn' funding, we had a clay oven built in the Gathering Area. We appreciate Rhyddian and Laura providing their expertise. It's all made from re-cycled materials and clay sourced from an area adjacent to the oven site.

The inaugural firing took place a month later, once the clay had dried out. This will be a great facility for community events, for cooking breads, pizzas, scones, pies, cakes ad casseroles even! Dunbar cubs were among the first to enjoy al fresco oven tasty bites, at their Halloween party. Spooky snacks were definitely on the menu!

BREEDING BIRD COMMUNITIES - LOCHEND WOODS

In 2012 David Bates and Marc Eden mapped the breeding birds of those parts of Lochend Woods managed by Dunbar Community Woodland Group. They came across 50 species including Mallard, Sparrowhawk, Buzzard, Cuckoo, Brambling and Common Crossbill. Commonest were Wren, Blackbird, Rook and Chaffinch. Scarcer breeders included Moorhen, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Goldcrest, House Martin, Longtailed Tit, Treecreeper, Mistle Thrush, Siskin and Bullfinch.

The gardens, as they mature, may attract more birds. Hole nesters such as Blue Tit and Great Tit were comparatively scarce or absent, perhaps due to the lack of dead or decaying trees. Felling of alien trees and replanting with natives as recommended in the management plan might be expected to change the bird community.
